It did not start well for Lee Valley as James Hatfull was sent to the sin bin at 01:30 for hooking and just 21 seconds later Bracknell scored their first powerplay goal.

The lead rose to 2-0 at 03:39 after errors from Hatfull and

Justin Grant resulted in an own goal that was credited to Bracknell's high-scoring Craig Tribe.

The Lions soon put the mistake behind them and hit back with goals from Ben Williams and Stas Profokiev brought them back to 2-2.

Bracknell's captain James Galazzi was due to receive two minutes for slashing when Lee Valley's Andrzej Maslak broke away, took the puck up the ice and slotted it neatly in the top corner to put the Lions 3-2 ahead.

Both sides continued to exchange scores after that, with Jon Anderson levelling things up for the hosts before Ben Williams put the east Londoners back in front.

The advantage didn't last long though as first Craig Tribe made it 4-4, before further goals from Chris Beauclerk, Tribe, Hardy and Anderson put Bracknell in the box-seat at 8-4.

Profokiev scored for the Lions at 58:01 on a delayed penalty, but it was too little too late as the hosts rounded off the scoring with a goal from Tony Barclay.
