It was Lions' Ben Osborne who opened the scoring in the second period, his goal at assisted by defenceman Ian Courtney.

Smith made a breakaway and struck the back of the net with another short-handed goal for Invicta.


This was followed by Smith's hat-trick goal at 38:34 which left George Alley with no chance to make a save.

Scott Beeson scored unassisted for the Lions with a terrific slapshot and the period ended 6-2 to the Dynamos. In this 20 minute spell, Lions scored with two out of seven shots, whereas Dynamos scored three out of 16, demonstrating 17-year-old Alley's competence in goal.

He faced the same number of shots from Invicta in the final period, while the Lions stepped up a gear by shooting 12 shots against Jonathan Silvester.

The Dynamos scored a further three times before the Lions could get past Silvester, despite the determined efforts of Matyas Vas.

The Lions' two final period goals both came courtesy of Ben Osborne. His hat-trick was only the second Lions hat-trick of the season, the first achieved by Kevin Murphy against Solent back in September 2005. Osborne's goals were assisted by Nick Braithwaite and Ben Shrubsole.
