The pleasure at going 1-0 up did not last long for the Lions. Romford were determined to overpower their visitors and it was Sam Park at 13mins 52secs who equalised.


Just two minutes later the Lions' defence fumbled in front of their own net and disaster struck as the puck inadvertently slipped in.

With a two-goal lead a win seemed highly likely for Lee Valley but seconds later Romford pulled one back through Matt Turner. The equaliser came from Matthew Brown for the Spitfires at 49mins 38secs.

A point for each team seemed fair in the circumstances but the hosts turned the screw and capitalised on a powerplay situation, when Matt Turner put the winner in the net at 51 mins 25 secs.
